



Protect Pasco County's Waterways Help Prevent Stormwater Pollution & Flooding



What You Can Do

- Protect our waterways from pollution and our land from flooding by properly disposing of trash and wastes.
- Keep storm drains, ditches and streets free of any material that shouldn't be there.
- Report any illegal discharges or dumping into storm drains, roads and waterways.
- Sweep up grass clippings/leaves and dispose in the trash or blow it back onto the lawn, not on the road or into a storm drain.
- Place pet wastes in designated pet waste containers.
- Sweep sidewalks, driveways and roads instead of using a hose.
- Use yard waste as a compost pile instead of disposing of it.
- Wash your car at a car wash facility that does not generate runoff.
- Use pesticides, herbicides and fertilizers appropriately on your lawn. These products are considered hazardous waste.
- Direct downspouts toward grass or flower beds, not the driveway! Better yet, use rain barrels.
- Dispose of cigarette butts in the trash not in the road or down storm drains.
