What is Household Hazardous Waste?

Leftover household products that contain corrosive, toxic, ignitable, or reactive ingredients are considered to be household hazardous waste (HHW). Products such as paints, cleaners, oils, batteries, and pesticides, that contain potentially hazardous ingredients require special care when you dispose of them.

Improper disposal of HHW can include pouring them down the drain, on the ground, into storm sewers, or in some cases putting them out with the trash. The dangers of such disposal methods might not be immediately obvious, but improper disposal of these wastes can pollute the environment and pose a threat to human health.

How can I Reduce My Use of HHW?

- Read the labels for words such as: Warning, Caution, and Danger.
- Follow all application guidelines.
- Choose safer alternatives or less toxic products.
- Buy only chemicals you need and in small quantities.
- Use all of the material that you can.

Where do I take my HHW?

Pasco County staff manages and operates two HHW centers for the safe handling, processing, and proper disposal of all wastes. Hazardous waste brought to the centers by County residents are either recycled or sent out to a permitted hazardous waste management facility for treatment.

The program is managed by the staff of Pasco County Utilities Service Branch.

Packaging Your Chemicals Properly for Your Own Safety.

- * Keep chemicals capped, and in their original containers with original labels.
- * Don't mix chemicals, particularly unknown chemicals.
- * Pack leaky containers in larger sound containers.
- * Place containers in sturdy boxes for transportation.
- * Place papers between containers to prevent breakage.
- * Place containers in the trunk or away from passengers.
