

**JOINT FEDERAL, STATE, LOCAL  
PUBLIC NOTICE

The Federal Emergency Management Agency and Florida Division of Emergency Management have received the following application for Federal grant funding. Final notice is hereby given of the Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) consideration to provide funding in the form of Hazard Mitigation Grant Program. Funds will be provided in accordance with Section 404 of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, Public Law 93-288, as amended.

Under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), federal actions must be reviewed and evaluated for feasible alternatives and for social, economic, historic, environmental, legal, and safety considerations. Under Executive Order (EO) 11988 and EO 11990 FEMA is required to consider alternatives to and to provide public notice of any proposed actions in or affecting floodplains or wetlands. EO 12898 also requires FEMA to provide the opportunity for public participation in the planning process and to consider potential impacts to minority or low-income populations.

Funding for the proposed project will be conditional upon compliance with all applicable federal, tribal, state and local laws, regulations, floodplain standards, permit requirements and conditions.

**Applicant:** Pasco County

**Project Title:** HMGP-4564-051 Pasco County, Manor Beach Road, Mitigation Reconstruction

**Location of Proposed Work** - Residents on Manor Beach Rd located at Port Richey, Florida 34652 may experience minor traffic disruptions due to the demolition and reconstruction of one property.

**Proposed Work and Purpose:**

The proposed project will demolish the current structure, build a new elevated structure in compliance with all applicable local, state, and federal codes, including compliance with ASCE 24-05. This project will help reduce damages to the structure from future flood events.

**Project Alternatives:**

The alternatives to the project that have been considered are 1) the no action alternative and 2) an acquisition demolition of the property. These alternatives to the proposed project are not viable because under Alternative 1) the homeowner would remain at risk to storm damage; and Alternative 2) would require the homeowner to relocate and they would like to remain on the property.

**Comment Period:**

Comments are solicited from the public; local, state or federal agencies; and other interested parties in order to consider and evaluate the impacts of the proposed project.
